WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT FOLLOWING YOUR LASER PROCEDURE?

Following your laser surgery you will see a significant improvement in your urinary symptoms that will continue to get better with time. You may wake up from your surgery with a catheter in place but generally the catheter is removed after one or two days.

Other than relief of your urinary symptoms, most patients experience no other effects on their lifestyle


or bodily functions as a result of their laser surgery. In certain cases prostate surgery can lead to retrograde ejaculation. This means that ejaculate can be redirected into



the bladder upon orgasm. If this possible side-effect is significant to you, let your surgeon know so that he can take steps to avoid it if possible.


All surgical procedures carry some risk. Your surgeon will be able to explain what unique risks might apply to your procedure.
